### DIGITALISE YOUR PASSPORT

Take a picture of your passport or other important documents. In the event that you lose these, you'll have a back-up in your phone to rely on.



### SAY 'NO' TO FANNY PACKS

Not only are they a fashion no-no, they're too easily accessible by thieves. Use a money belt instead; hide it under your clothes so it lies flat against your body.



### LOCALS KNOW BEST

Consult the hotel staff on the safety in your area and ask for directions beforehand. Knowing your bearings helps you be alert of your surroundings.



### DO A HEADCOUNT

Always keep an eye on your travel partners. Determine a safe place to meet beforehand in case someone gets lost, especially if travelling with children.



### WALLETS FOR DIFFERENT OCCASIONS

Separate your money in 'dummy wallets', one for going out and another back in the hotel safe. Carry only what you need or split it with a travel partner.
